African students of M.K. Ammosov North-Eastern Federal University (NEFU) took part in various events dedicated to the International Day of Francophonie.



Students from French-speaking countries not only participated in university events but also traveled to various secondary schools in the uluses (districts) of the Republic of Sakha. The French-speaking students visited Mayinsky Lyceum and the V.P. Artamonov Sakha-French Lyceum.

As part of the preparation for the 2nd Siberian-African Youth Summit, which is one of the main events of the Siberian-African Consortium, African students of NEFU participated in the scientific-practical seminar "Francophonie: A Space for Multilateral Cooperation." NEFU is an active member of the RAFU consortium.
